Welcome

In Jacksonville, tales of Illinois' frontier days reverberate throughout historic halls of some of the state's oldest institutions, as do the harrowing accounts of people escaping the chains of slavery and those who aided their quest for freedom at the city's Underground Railroad sites. Our legendary past blends with new investment taking place around our gorgeous downtown square, where vibrant, independent businesses occupy storefronts that have stood over the city for generations – monuments to a storied past now fostering a thriving present and an exciting future.

But Jacksonville is more than just old buildings. Here, the area's brightest artistic minds are highlighted – as are those who came before – in a stunning, Second Empire-style mansion at the David Strawn Art Gallery. The latest blockbusters fill audiences' minds with excitement and wonder at Illinois Theater, the city's longest-running cinema. Melodic live music and student-run theater performances engross captivated audiences. Bold, alluring flavors occupy repurposed spaces, from woodfired pizza in a refurbished storefront to locally sourced American fare at the city's historic train depot while the down-home, rustic charm of our agritourism destinations serves as an indicator of the farming heritage that fuels our local economy and helps feed the nation. The city's outdoor spaces at Nichols Park and Lake Jacksonville provide plenty of common ground to stretch out, bike, or hike through the natural Central Illinois beauty – as well as some of the best bass fishing in the state. And in nearby Meredosia, nature lovers get up close and personal with majestic bald eagles soaring high above the Illinois River.

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History

Our beloved town is steeped in history. Plenty of cities make that claim, but in Jacksonville, we're serious about the legends that originated right here in our own back yard. In fact, you'd be hard-pressed to find a city of this size with so many well-preserved historical sites – mansions, storefronts, farmsteads, and so many more remarkable locales. Jacksonville is the perfect place to not just hear about history, but to immerse yourself in it and experience it.

THE PATH TO FREEDOM

For those escaping the chains of slavery – and those looking to break them once and for all – Jacksonville was a haven on the Underground Railroad. Today, the city recognizes nine locations as stops on the Underground Railroad, including the remarkably preserved **Woodlawn Farm** five miles east of town and the **Asa Talcott House** at 859 Grove St. The city of Jacksonville also became a catalyst in the abolitionist movement. Edward Beecher, brother of "Uncle Tom's Cabin" author Harriet Beecher Stowe, served as the first president of **Illinois College**, which itself became a center for abolitionism at the time. Other proud abolitionists like Jonathan B. Turner and Benjamin Henderson also fought tirelessly to guarantee freedom for all people.

Twist and Shout!

As Beatlemania swept the nation in the mid-1960s, demand for Beatles records prompted Capitol Records to open a plant right here in Jacksonville to press and distribute the Fab Four's albums. The plant has since closed, but record collectors today can recognize a Jacksonville-pressed Beatles record by its oblong "O" and the initials "JW" in the runout groove.





NOW THAT'S CRAFTSMANSHIP

Originally part of the State Hospital grounds, the beautiful **Bandstands of Community Park** feature exquisite Victorian detail and incredibly preserved construction, earning them recognition in the Smithsonian Institution.

LOOKING FOR LINCOLN

Follow in the footsteps of the Great Emancipator! Abraham Lincoln made numerous trips to Jacksonville, including a stop on his 1858 Senate campaign where he delivered a stirring, two-and-a-half-hour speech against slavery. Walk where Lincoln walked with the **Looking for Lincoln** print guide directing you to wayside exhibits around town and further immerse yourself in the history with an audio tour featuring stories as told by those who knew him best.

THE GOVERNOR'S FRONTIER HOME

No, you didn't take a wrong turn. In the state's young frontier days, then-Governor Joseph Duncan's spacious, 17-room mansion served as the official Governor's Mansion from 1834-1838. Today, the **Governor Duncan Mansion** houses many of the Duncan family's original furnishings. Listed on the National Register of Historic Places since 1971, the mansion is open for tours on Wednesdays and Saturdays from Memorial Day to Labor Day.

BIG WHEEL KEEP ON TURNIN'

As home to the **Eli Bridge Company**, Jacksonville has been the Carnival Capital of the Country for more than a century. Big Eli Wheels and Scramblers... they both began right here in Jacksonville. While the Big Eli Company isn't open for tours, visitors are welcome to take a spin on the Big Eli Wheel during summer and autumn months in **Community Park**.



HISTORY ON DISPLAY

The newest addition to Jacksonville's many historic sites is arguably one of the most definitive. Housed in the former post office that closed in the early 1970s, the **Jacksonville Area Museum** features a broad range of exhibits showcasing the city's history, including its role as a center for retail, manufacturing, and educational institutions. The **Jacksonville**

African American History Museum, housed in the

Asa Talcott Home, details the lives of Black Americans throughout history and their work and contributions both locally and nationally. The **Illinois School for the Deaf Alumni Association Museum** guides visitors through the history of the school and its commitment to providing a quality education to the deaf community.

Art & Culture

Jacksonville is a city that appreciates the fine arts. Galleries – and 12 building facades around town – are adorned with masterpieces from artists both local and international. Meanwhile, live performances from singers, musicians, actors, and poets steal the spotlight on the weekend. Experience a community where modern artists share galleries and stages with the proud names that came before to carry on a legacy of entertainment.



DAVID STRAWN ART GALLERY

A HOME FOR THE ARTS

Housed in a Second Empire mansion deeded by Dr. David Strawn to the Art Association of Jacksonville in 1915, the **David Strawn Art Gallery** provides a gallery experience like none other. Local artists are featured alongside permanent collections including the Miriam Cowgur Allen Doll collection, the Mediterranean Artifacts Collection, and North American, Mesoamerican, and South American pottery dating back thousands of years. Additionally, three rooms on the mansion's second floor – including original owner, Phebe Strawn's bedroom – are decorated with the home's original furnishings.

Live From Jacksonville

Both local and nationally touring acts stop in Jacksonville to serenade crowds with live performances. **Waters Edge Winery & Bistro**, **Soap Co. Coffee House**, and **KJB's** all host frequent live music events. Got a song in your heart you need to let the world hear? Soap Co. hosts open mic nights for local musicians and poets to share their passion with the community.

TAKIN' IT TO THE STREETS

Adorning the historic buildings around downtown, the **Jacksonville Walldog Murals** detail the lives and history that shaped our city, including Abraham Lincoln's rousing anti-slavery speech during his 1858 Senate campaign and General Ulysses S. Grant's famous march down what is now **State Street**. Hand-painted by artists from across the U.S. – and even as far away as Australia and Ireland – the 12 Walldog Murals around Jacksonville offer a colorful glimpse into our fascinating history.

ON WITH THE SHOW

With mainstage plays, student-directed shows, and improv troupes, **Illinois College Theatreworks** offers live entertainment throughout the academic year at both the 250-seat **Sibert Theatre** and the more intimate **Illinois College Experimental Blackbox Theatre**.

MAESTRO, IF YOU PLEASE

Filling the air with its rendition of classic melodies, the **Jacksonville Symphony Society** is ranked one of the top orchestras in the state. With five performances throughout the year, the talented musicians of the JSS work with guest performers from around the country – and the world – with genres including classical, holiday, and pop music.

SONGS ON THE SQUARE

The beautiful **Central Park** square becomes an outdoor concert venue every summer during the **Jacksonville Main Street Downtown Concert Series** on Fridays in June and July. This free, family-friendly event includes numerous food trucks and other dining options, and of course, live music. Stick around for the after-party!



OUR FEATURE PRESENTATION

Under a vintage, neon marquee, film lovers of all ages can enjoy a classic movie-going experience at the **Illinois Theater**, the longest-running cinema in Jacksonville. Featuring five screens and balcony theaters, this remarkable monument to the silver screen is a callback to community theaters of yesteryear.



Outdoors

We weren't made to spend our entire lives indoors. Human beings need wide-open spaces to move around, explore, and take in a breath of fresh air – concrete jungles soaked in the aroma of burning gasoline and diesel won't cut it. The natural beauty of Central Illinois shines brightest in the Jacksonville area with ample opportunities to commune with nature.

FUN ON THE WATER

Jacksonville residents are blessed to have not just one, but two fabulous lakes perfect for year-round, outdoor excursions. Located south of town off IL-267, **Lake Jacksonville** features 500 acres of manmade splendor with plenty of space for boating, skiing, and other watersports. **Mauvaisterre Lake** features a boat launch accessible for most recreational boats – though motors exceeding 25 horsepower are only allowed to operate at idling speed. Up for some paddling? Nearby **Nichols Park** includes kayak launches onto the lake, allowing visitors an opportunity to glide peacefully across still waters.

Bass Heaven

The lakes around Jacksonville are acclaimed hotspots for big lunkers – in fact, Field & Stream named Jacksonville the No. 1 bass fishing destination in Illinois and No. 4 in the Midwest. Bluegill, crappie, and channel catfish abound in our waters, but nothing compares to the thrill of reeling in a trophy bass – or your friends' reactions when you show them the photos!

HIT THE TRAILS

Ever have the urge to just wander into the forest and revel in the unspoiled serenity of Mother Nature? Whether you traverse by foot or on two wheels, Jacksonville offers miles of peaceful trails to explore. Located east of town on Vandalia Road, the quarter-mile trails at the **Emma Mae Leonhard Wildlife Sanctuary & Nature Trail** run adjacent to **Mauvaisterre Lake** and offer tree identification signage, making it a perfect destination to observe local flora and fauna. At **Lake Jacksonville**, the paved **Lake Jacksonville Trail** provides a smooth, pleasant journey and scenic vistas along the northern lakeshore, while the **Crimson and Rocket Trails** on the southern shore offer 1.5 miles of rugged, unpaved trails, both completing an ideal getaway for hikers and bikers alike.





PARKS & REC

Varied in amenities and activities, the parks around Jacksonville offer a broad spectrum of outdoor experiences.

Nichols Park, a sprawling 86-acre green space, includes an Olympic-size swimming pool, playground, and golf course, along with gazebos and shelters perfect for reunions and gatherings. More intimate outdoor venues provide a quiet spot to stop and relax with your four-legged friends.

EAGLES ON THE RIVER

Though bald eagle populations have skyrocketed in recent years – a testament to nationwide conservation efforts – catching a glimpse of these spectacular birds of prey is still an unforgettable experience. Located roughly 20 miles west of Jacksonville via US-67, the village of **Meredosia** on the banks of the **Illinois River** offers a rare sighting of our nation's symbol as it spends its winter months hunting high above the flowing currents. Brave the late winter cold and bring a pair of binoculars to see these majestic animals like you've never seen before!

ROUGH IT

Love sleeping underneath the stars and waking up to the sounds of nature? Or do you prefer to bring your modern luxuries with you? Whatever your idea of camping is – canvas tent or RV hookup – the campgrounds around Jacksonville can accommodate. The **Lake Jacksonville Campground** features RV parking and tent camping with shower facilities, overlooking the lake. The pristine **Buena Vista Farms** includes 68 RV sites, each with full hookups, picnic table, and fire ring, plus cabin rentals, on-site fishing, canoeing and kayaking, paddle boats, hiking and biking trails, and more.






